OHEA Member Privacy Statement

The Ontario Home Economics Association (OHEA) commits itself to the responsible collection, use and disclosure of the personal information of its members in accordance with Canada's Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (PIPEDA) and An Act respecting the Ontario Home Economics Association, Chapter PR38, Statutes of Ontario, 1989.

The personal information that you provide to OHEA when you become a member, or when you renew your membership, is used by OHEA alone. OHEA will not disclose any of your personally identifiable information without your prior consent except under special circumstances, such as when we believe in good faith that the law requires disclosure. OHEA does not share the personal information you provide to us with other companies. Your name and contact information will be published in OHEA's Membership Directory unless you opt out of this service by contacting OHEA's office, or by so indicating on your membership application/renewal form. Reasonable efforts are made to ensure that the information included in the Membership Directory is accurate and updated on a regular basis. OHEA's Membership Directory is distributed only to OHEA Members.

In addition to the collection of contact information, OHEA may also request copies of post-secondary school transcripts to confirm membership eligibility. This information is used only to confirm membership eligibility and the protection of this information meets PIPEDA criteria.

Membership Category Definitions

4.01 Registered Member

- (i) A Registered member is one who has:
- (1) a degree in the field of home economics or its equivalent, as defined by the Board of Directors, from a recognized university or polytechnical institute; and
 - (2) proof of a credit course or equivalent, recognized and approved by the Board of Directors, that includes orientation to the philosophy and practice of home economics or completion of the Interim Professional Home Economist Program; and
 - (3) agreed in writing to adhere to the intent as well as the letter of the Code of Ethics of the Association.
- (ii) The following equivalencies, as defined by the Board of Directors, will be considered for Registered Member status:
- (1) Masters or Ph.D. in the field of Home Economics or its equivalent are considered comparable to subsection 4.01(i)(2); or
 - (2) a minimum of 10 years' work experience in the field of Home Economics or its equivalent are considered comparable to subsection 4.01(i)(2).

OR

Effective January 27, 2003, the Ontario Home Economics Association mutually recognizes and accepts registered members from other Canadian provincial home economics associations granting registered professional status who have signed the "Mutual Recognition Agreement on Labour Mobility for Home Economists and Human Ecologists". Such a registered member will be accepted as a registered member of the Ontario Home Economics Association by:

- Filing an Ontario Home Economics Association membership application form, and,
- Provision by the registrar of the registered member's original province of membership, of an affidavit confirming the member's current registered status in good standing as well as a copy of the member's file, including a copy of transcripts, if available, and
- Payment of appropriate fees.

Such accepted members are obliged to adhere to the membership requirements of all registered members as described in the legislation and bylaws governing the Ontario Home Economics Association, including those for maintaining registered status.

Registered members shall have voting privileges and may hold elective and appointive offices. Members in this classification may use the designation Professional Home Economist and/or the initials P.H.Ec. granted by An Act Respecting the Ontario Home Economics Association, 1989.

4.02 Provisional Member

- (1) A Provisional member is one who has acquired the academic qualifications specified in subsection 4.01(i)(1) but who lacks the course or Interim Professional Home Economist Program requirement described in subsection 4.01(i)(2).
- (2) Provisional members who apply under subsection 4.02 (1) shall be granted this status on a yearly basis for not more than two consecutive years.
- (3) Provisional members who do not complete the requirements for Registered status within the two consecutive years specified will automatically be assigned to Associate status. Such members will still be eligible to complete qualifications for Registered status described in subsection 4.01(i)(2).

Provisional members may attend meetings but may not hold voting privileges and may not hold elective or appointive offices.

4.03 Student Member

A Student member is one who is enrolled (part- or full-time) at a Canadian University offering a Home Economics-related degree program or graduate study, a post-degree faculty of education program or involved in a dietetic internship that would make the student eligible upon graduation to qualify for Registered status or for the IPHE program. A Student member may attend meetings and hold appointive office but may not have voting privileges.

4.04 Associate Member

An Associate member is one who does not qualify to apply for Registered membership, and

- (1) has a diploma in the field of home economics from a recognized College of Arts and Science, or Ryerson Polytechnical Institute, or Kemptville College of Agricultural Technology or Centralia College of Agricultural Technology or Alfred College of Agriculture and Food Technology, or
- (2) is a person currently engaged in the field of home economics and whose application meets the approval of the Board of Directors.

Associate members shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Association but shall not have voting privileges and shall not be eligible for appointive or elective office.

4.05 Affiliate Member

An Affiliate member is any organization that has an interest in and supports the objectives of the Association. Affiliate members shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Association but shall not have voting privileges and shall not be eligible for appointive or elective office. An Affiliate member may designate an official representative to hold its membership and to attend meetings.

4.06 Retired and Active Retired Members

A Retired member is one who:

- (1) has been a member in good standing for a minimum of five years,
- (2) is not deriving income from any Home Economics-related activities, and
- (3) specifically requests retirement status.

Retired members shall have the same privileges as the category they were in previous to applying for retirement status.

An Active Retired member is one who:

- (1) has been a member in good standing for a minimum of five years,
- (2) has retired from a full-time position but is deriving part-time income from a Home Economics-related activity averaging 15 hours per week, and
- (3) specifically requests Active retirement status.

Active Retired members shall have the same privileges as the category they were in previous to applying for Active retirement status

4.07 Corresponding Member

A Corresponding member is one who:

- (1) has been a member in good standing for a minimum of five years,
- (2) is not deriving income from any Home Economics-related or other activities, and
- (3) specifically requests Corresponding member status.

Corresponding members shall not have voting privileges and shall not be eligible for appointive or elective office. They shall receive publications and other general information provided to the membership but shall not use the P.H.Ec. designation. A Corresponding member may be reinstated to his/her previous membership category within three years. In special cases, the Membership Committee may review the extended renewal of a Corresponding Member after three years.

4.08 Honorary and Honorary Life Members

- (1) The Board of Directors may confer Honorary Life membership on any current or previous Registered member of the Association which it wishes to honour in accordance with established criteria. An Honorary Life Member shall pay no dues, but may use the P.H.Ec. designation.
- (2) The Board of Directors, by unanimous vote, may confer Honorary membership to a non-member who has rendered valuable service to the field of home economics or its equivalent. An Honorary Member shall pay no dues and shall not use the P.H.Ec. designation.
- (3) Honorary and Honorary Life Members shall not have voting privileges nor be eligible for elective or appointive office.
